Note: Batteries may now be placed in small bag and left atop black bin

Shredded paper may be placed in bottom of Green bin to absorb moisture.

"Bio-degradable" does NOT mean "Compostable"

SFRecology provides free of charge 2 pick-ups per year for bulky items.

Glass ware goes into Black bin, BOTTLES, into Blue.

Textiles (socks, etc) in a basketball (or smaller) size bag into Blue bin.

Wax paper inserts, packing plastic bags rolled-up into 1 bag, tetra pacs into Blue bin.
