Jessica Ho: Family background impressed in her the need for public transportation and public housing. Worked with Carmen Chu and Katy Tang who served as mentors. Helping people solve their problems is primary aim: homelessness, public transportation, Sunset Blvd. and looks forward to assisting people of the Parkside-Sunset providing equal access to government whether living here for generations or just arrived.

• SFMTA parking map from last month, member comments

Name escapes. Project Management over all departments to work together in giving merchants input. What can be done to mitigate impact on merchants and residents. Create programs for businesses when projects are undertaken. Mitigation Levels to lessen impact of project upon businesses: 1) Construction Mitigation. 2) Contact Person to address concerns in the field. 3) Ambassadors walking the corridors who know the people involved in the moving parts pf the project.

<u>West Portal</u>: Get contractors to shop at impacted shops, advertising to tell populace business is open, assumption that business owners who to advertise their service.

Taraval: Good Neighbor Policy: Parking mitigation plan if parking is going to be impacted more than 30 days, permits must be obtained. If space is not being used by noon, space may be used. Ambassadors will be on hand or call 311. Policy will now be enforced. Contractors have learned to get under the 30 day rule. Language has been now included in contact to enforce Good Neighbor Policy.

<u>*Transit Only Lane:*</u> Ought not be finalized until thoroughly analyzed as to alleged time-saving benefit. Supervisor Tang's office gets the complaints and SFMTA remains unresponsive.

<u>Great Highway:</u> Removal of parking is done for a safety issue in the mind of the SFMTA. Notification is important yet not actually practical to carry out. Loosing parking, increasing safety. SFMTA will continue working on communicating with residents. Preliminary design for discussion.

Left Lane: People must be informed prior to implementation. The new protocol will be more exact in informing people of impacting possibilities.

<u>SFMTA New Appointment</u>: Have someone in the neighborhood nominated who is more responsive to needs of the community.

To Ed Risken: Roll it back, it is not working.
