Question: What would you do with SFMTA?

Arthur Tom: Quantifiable performance standards. Call for an audit.

Tuan Nguyen: New director. SFMTA's communication with public is lax. Not transparent. Little foresight.

Question: What would you do regarding housing density?

Lou Ann Bassan: Environmental outlook. Earthquake is coming. Sunset not covered by earthquake water system. Look at the housing stocks we now have. 40K units are off market, 10-15K off market because of tenant. More tenant, less landlord protection.

Arthur Tom: 1913 water reserve limited to 19th Ave. Current cisterns need to be emptied by fire truck. Owners will not rent if Costa-Hawkins passes.

Tuan Nguyen: Legalize in-laws. Built toward transit corridors. Does support repeal of Costa-Hawkins and is not as knowledge of the real estate market as Arthur Tom.
