Phil Ting: Updates on Assembly activities. USA and Japan and Germany have larger economies than California’s. How to combat homelessness and affordable housing up and down the state. Lennette Thompson for School Board. Educational resources and funds are misdirected. CPUs are not provided yet students are tested on same. Teacher retention/pay. Lost 375 teachers last year. One Teacher moved to San Rafael, receives \$30K more and bought a house. STEM Program. Bring back woodshop, home ecc, etc. Aim: self-reliant students. Address problems for low achieving students. 2007 meditation 15/15 minutes morning and afternoon. 4 years attendance went up, suspensions went down, GPAs went up. Used in other schools. Removed because teachers wanted more time to teach academics. Wants to bring back Mindful meditation. lennettethompson.com

Keith Bogdon for Assembly. Affordable Housing needing a balance between East (Manhattanization) and West (neighborhoods). Wants to preserve local flavor. Invest in infrastructure – no water projects since 1979.
