Captain Nick Rainsford, a Sunset local (St. Gabriel, Sacred Heart) whose goal is to focus on property crime and utilizing video footage to catch criminals from citizens and police cameras. SFPD will upload crime footage on Twitter account @SFPDTaraval.

BART Board Member Janice Li, where she explain BART's role on the Westside of the City. Her district covers Embarcadero, Montgomery and Powell Stations and she advocates for the Daly City Station since it is the closest to the Sunset.

SFMTA for coming and presenting about the upcoming Taraval Project that will take 2 years+ to complete. We appreciate the outreach and cooperation with the local community on this Parkside changing project.

Supervisor Gordon Mar and Aide Daisy Quan, our newly minted D4 Supervisor and staff! We are grateful he came and spoke about issues important to him and his reporting of what he has done so far in his first month in his new job. He is advocating for using the \$181 million dollar ERAF money for teacher salary increases, affordable housing and City construction mitigation support to small businesses. On the affordable housing side, Supervisor Mar wants to use existing housing inventory to bring on line more units to the affordable housing market using easing of code rules, tax incentives and non-profit support.

II. (7:05-7:15) Taraval Precinct Police Announcements

Lead: Captain Nick Rainsford or designated Officer

Captain Nick Rainsford: (see above) Marine, carpenter, SFPD – patrol. Car break-ins – major peeve. 2017-2018 19% drop. 2017 -1800 break-ins, 2018 – 1450 break-ins Stonestown. Crime Analysis Unit uses software “Business Intelligence” to deploy officers where most needed. What happens at the courts is out of SFPD’s control. Home Burglaries: down 2% from 2017-2018. Undercover officers using bait bikes and cars. Recently incident, bike burglary observed by SFPD and 22 hrs later charges dismissed yet stayed in custody because of propagation violation. No probable cause. Future incidents will be videoed. Regardless, SFPD is doing their job. Taraval Station has 160 thousand residents, largest district. Subscribe to Taraval Station newsletter. 85 officers allotted, 80 active. More desired/

Topic: Janice Li (see above) is our new BART Board member and she wants to discuss how BART benefits the West Side of the City. Sam Mateo County did not opt-into the system, not represented.

IV. (7:20-7:55) SFMTA Construction Discussion

Topic: See Handout. Amy Lam, Project Manner. Tunnel and Taraval L Line completed 100 years ago. Project will take place with shuttles in 2 segments and 2 blocks at a time within each segment. Transit Lanes: (4th page) Left hand turns OK. Transit ONLY lanes to remain. Traffic signals will decrease stacking-up than stop signs. 19th Ave is a CalTrans property and allow signals timed to flow of 19th Ave traffic rather than Taraval. Moved, Seconded, Carried: POPS urge SFMTA to study, which is to include surveys in person and on-line, the impact on merchants and residents of the transit only lanes and other than transit only lanes. Note: 46th and Taraval (Last page) where L Taraval turns left.
